Even though we are not physically together, learning happens every day. This #keeplearning Board is designed to keep families and schools engaged with learning while we are apart.

The following lists of activities are at varying levels of difficulty. These are learning opportunities that you may choose to do at home with your child.

| <i>Social-Emotional</i> | <i>English Language Arts</i> *Read for 20 minutes EVERY DAY!* | <i>Writing</i> | <i>Math</i> |
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| Keep a daily journal. Write about anything you would like. How are you feeling? What are some things that make you happy? | Retell what happened in the book to someone. | Write a letter to someone. If possible, address an envelope and mail it! Practice writing your full name in cursive. | Create math flashcards for multiplication facts 2's through 12's. |
| Do a chore for someone in your family. (Go out of your way to do something that is not your usual job.) | Find 5 nouns and 5 verbs. Put them in ABC order. | Write directions on how to prepare your favorite breakfast, lunch, or dinner. Be sure to include details in every step so that anyone could read your directions and know what to do. Practice writing your full name in cursive. | Practice telling time on an analog clock. Look at the clock throughout the day! |
| Help the Earth! Go outside and pick up trash. | Write a summary about what you read as if you were a news reporter. (Be sure to include the who, what, where, when, why and how.) | Write a pretend story about you going to outer space. Make sure to have characters, setting, problem, and solution. Practice writing your full name in cursive. | Create a daily schedule that shows what an average Saturday looks like in your life. Start with the time you wake up and list at least 10 events that you would complete during the day with the last event being when you would go to bed. List the number of hours and minutes between each event. |

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| <p>Create a list of 5 ways you are unique.</p> | <p>Draw a picture of your favorite part and write a caption.</p> | <p>Interview someone at your house. Ask them questions and write their responses. (What is your favorite color?, What is your favorite food? etc....)</p> <p>Practice writing your full name in cursive.</p> | <p>Have someone set up your multiplication fact cards around a room. Move around the room as quickly as you can and answer as many as you can correctly in one minute. Repeat until all facts are answered.</p> |
| <p>Do a random act of kindness for someone in your home or neighborhood.</p> | <p>Read your kitchen! Read the cereal boxes, food boxes, cans, and write down 10 interesting words. Put them in alphabetical order.</p> | <p>Practice writing and punctuating your address. Practice writing your full name in cursive.</p> | <p>Henry has a new album for his Pokemon cards. He uses pages that hold 6 cards and pages that hold 3 cards. If Henry has 36 cards, how many different ways can he put them in his album? Draw a picture to help you solve the problem.</p> |
