Dear Blue Jay Families,


I hope the beginning of the school year has started off smoothly and perhaps seems a little more "normal" than the last couple of years. Getting back into a school routine can be a little tough at the beginning, for adults and kids as we get back to a sleep schedule, hurried mornings, juggling practices and finding time for homework. As a school counselor, it is my job, and my privilege to help students navigate the school day, and to help with big emotions and problem solving, executive functioning skills, and collaboration. A regular day starts out checking emails and phone messages, and when students arrive, I check in with students and greet them in the hallways. During primary weeks, I teach K-2 (SEL) classes in the morning, and during intermediate weeks, I teach 3-6th grade SEL (social-emotional-learning). Lessons are based on our **CARE** traits (**C**ollaborate, **A**ct Responsibly, **R**espect, and **E**mpower), as well as our **Second Step Curriculum**, which is also taught by the classroom teachers.

I have also eaten lunch with new students, and I have started eating lunch with different grade level students. This is a good opportunity for me to learn more about students and for them to learn more about each other. This is a laid-back time and it's a little quieter than the café.

Library News from Mrs. Hall

We kicked off the year in the library and students are checking out new books to read and enjoy! Check out for students happens every week during their library class. Kindergarten students check out 1 book at a time and 1st-6th grade students can check out up to 3 books. Students have learned how to put books on hold and library staff deliver books daily to students in their classrooms. You can check out the <u>JS Library website</u> to view the catalog, complete 20 book challenge forms, and so much more!



Books & Bundts Reading Challenge

We have partnered with Nothing Bundt Cakes to challenge students to read 400 minutes each month. Reading trackers were sent home during library classes and you can support your student by reading with them, listening to them read, or helping them track their minutes. A parent signature is required to show completion of their reading minutes. Once

students complete 400 minutes, they need to bring it to the library and Mrs. Hall or Mrs. Pretsch will sign it. Then, students can turn it in at Nothing Bundt Cakes for a free bundlet. We are hoping this will be a great monthly challenge to encourage at-home reading. Just 20 minutes a day for 20 days = 400 minutes. You got this, Blue Jays!

20 Book Challenge

Students and teachers are competing to complete 20 or 40 book challenges this year! Each book students read that is 50+ pages can count. They simply need to fill out the form located on the JS Library website for each book they complete. The challenge runs all year, until May 12, and it is a fun way to see the progress teachers and students are making on their independent reading.
