## Girls Tennis

The JV team went undefeated while also sweeping all spots of the city championship. The city champs team consisted of Emerie Catlin, Clana Evans, Isabelle Haggard, Gabriella Martinez, Haidyn McPike, Cora Sabel, and Lydia Wegele.

Varsity started slow with a third at city, and one point loss at league. They came back to win the regional. The regional champs team consisted of Hailey Beck, Mena DiMarzio, Katherine Fritz, Claire Ireland, Meredith Kucera, and Kayla Peter. The two who managed to bring the trophy back home were Kate Fritz and Meredith Kucera, a huge shout out to them and the rest of their team. Our motto was always "We Can, We Will." Congrats to our city Champs Hailey Beck and Ciana Evans in doubles.


## Boys Soccer

The boys varsity soccer team finished the season at 16-5-0 and took 4th place in the Class 6A state tournament. It was the 15th appearance in the Final Four in school history. They won the Centennial League for the 28th consecutive season by going 5-0 in league play and outscoring opponents 29-1. Went 2-1 in the prestigious Great River Classic in Burlington, lowa. We defeated Marquette HS 3-2 and Waukesha West HS 2-1, both of Wisconsin. Marquette took 2nd place at the Division 1 state tournament in Wisconsin (their biggest class). Waukesha West was a semi-finalist in Division 2. Rural scored 82 goals on the season, the 4th most in school history.

Easton Bradstreet recorded 29 goals and 16 assists. His 29 goals was the 2nd highest total in school history for one season. He finished tied for most goals in a career with 57. Easton also finished his career with 33 assists, 3rd most in school history. His 16 assists in one season is tied for 4th most in school history. Devon Rutschmann recorded 16 goals and 17 assists. His 17 assists is tied for the second most recorded in a single season. He now has 26 career assists in just two seasons, which ranks 9th in school history.

## Football

This year our football team repeated their success from last year going 8-3. This marks the first back-to-back $8+$ win seasons in the last 30 years. The football team also became Regional Champions for the first time since 2016.

This was a historic season for the offense. They averaged 31.5 points, 190.45 rushing yards, and 185 passing yards. Branton DeWeese set the most passing yards in a season (1884), and the most touchdowns (25), Titan Osburn set the single-season TD receptions (12), Ma’kenttis Adams set a new record for rushing yards (1396) and rushing touchdowns (17). Ma'knettis also went on to win the team's 2022 offensive player of the year. Dayton Smoot won the team's 2022 Special teams player of the year award.

The defense had another fantastic season, averaging 80.9 yards rushing, 230.9 total yards, and only allowing 18.1 points per game. The defense forced a total of 29 turnovers and scored 42 points throughout the entire season. Packson Bettis set the single-season sack (10), and QB pressures (12) record. JC Heim tied the single-season forced fumbles record with Jamond Lane (5), and tied with Walker Thompson and Ty Weber for fumble recoveries (3). Ty Weber had an outstanding year, setting single-season records for the team in tackles (134), solo tackles (82), tackles for loss (19), and set the school record for most tackles in a career (413). Ty also won the team's 2022 defensive player of the year and the team's MVP.


## Dancin' Blues

The WRHS Dancin' Blues competed at the third KSHSAA State Game Day Dance Competition on Friday November 18. They first competed their 3 routines individually against 17 other teams for a chance to make finals, where they took the top 6 teams to compete one last time. The dance team made finals and competed their 3 routines consecutively against the best 5 teams in the state. The team placed 2nd overall in the 6A division with a score of 93.17 . The team is very proud of what they accomplished at state and they are excited for the rest of the season, consisting of basketball performances and more competitions.

## WRHS Cheer

On Saturday November 19, Cheer competed at the KSHSAA Game Day Cheer State competition. Cheer competed their routines against 17 other 6A teams for a chance to make finals where the top 6 teams competed their whole routine again. They made finals and competed their whole routine one last time where they placed 2 nd in the 6A division with a score of 91.00 . They are the only team in the 6A division to be in the top 2 for 5 years straight! (2018: 2nd, 2019: 2nd, 2020: 1st, 2021: 2nd, 2022: 2nd)


## Volleyball

The WRHS Lady Blues won the 6A State Championships with a 45-1 record. The team lost a match early in the season, but went on a 43-match winning streak. The K.V.A. recognized Brooklyn DeLeye as Player of the Year and first team all-state 6A, as well as Taylor Russell as 1st team, Jada Ingram as 2nd team, and Zoe Canfield as Honorable Mention all-state. Kevin Bordewick was also recognized as Coach of the Year. The team only dropped four sets all season long, enroute to winning the 8th state title in program history.

## Golf

The 2022 Girls Golf Team found a ton of success on the golf course this season. As a team they finished as city champions for the tenth year in a row, runner-up at the Centennial League Championship, third at 6a regionals, and fourth at 6a state. Individually the girls had 3 on first team all city and first team all league. All in all the ladies had a great season!


## Cross Country

Washburn Rural Cross Country was anything but short of success this season. The team was led by a total of nine seniors this year. October was championship season, bringing in many trophies and medals. Starting off at the city championship race, Washburn Rural displayed dominance. The boys continued their impressive sixteen-year streak and secured yet another city title. On the girl's side, they won their fourth straight city title with an impressive finish across the board. Following this was Leauge. Both teams had a successful day with a first-place team finish on both sides. The girl's side brought in a second-year streak as well. Onto the regional meet, both teams had a runner-up finish qualifying both teams to the state championship race the following weekend. The boys were up first with a solid team of runners. They ended up placing 10th out of 12 teams in the final race. For the girls, the top seven had a solid chance at a podium finish. After a tight race the whole way, the girls ended up placing third for the first time since 1997. This past season was definitely one for the history books and brought in much success and hope for the future.

## CTE Career Fair

On Wednesday, November 9, more than 1,100 WRHS students participated in the CTE Career Fair. Fifty local business and industry professionals representing more than 25 companies served as guest speakers during 2nd, 3rd, and 4th periods. Students heard about educational and training requirements, entry level positions, and career paths from the speakers who represented a variety of occupations.

The Career Fair was presented by McCownGordon Construction and sponsored by HTK Architects, Mammoth Sports Construction, HyVee, and WRHS student business enterprises Common Grounds and The Shack.

## National Technical Honor Society

The Washburn Rural Chapter of NTHS is planning the 2022-23 Induction Ceremony to be held on November 29th at 6:30 in the Library. This year we will be inducting 24 students who have demonstrated strong skills in CTE Courses. The candidates are required to maintain a GPA of at 3.75. The students are nominated by a CTE teacher, complete an application packet and must be approved by the WRHS Administration and Counseling Staff.

These students uphold the following attributes of the National Technical Honor Society. Skill, Honesty, Service, Responsibility, Scholarship, Citizenship and Leadership.

## Robotics Club

Robotics competition. BEST (Boosting Engineering, Science \& Technology) inspires and motivates high school students to pursue degrees and careers in engineering, science and technology through participation in a sports-like contest.

The Kansas BEST competition, hosted by the Wichita State University College of Engineering, challenges students to build a remote-controlled robot using only specific competition kit materials within an eight-week period. Teams must design, build, and test a robot that can outperform their competitors. Professional engineers and teachers volunteer to coach middle and high school teams through the engineering design process. The team placed 12th out of 29 teams.

## Programming and Software Development Pathway

"To me and Tyler, the KU Design Competition we took part in was so much more than just a competition. When deciding on a project, we had the idea for a website that we realized had the potential to be something beyond a submission for the competition. It was both my and Tyler's first time ever creating a website, and so we had to learn as we created it, only adding to the challenge. However, classes like Web Page Design and AP Computer Science helped tremendously in providing a foundation for how to approach the challenge. In the end, we took 3rd place, and plan to continue work on this website and eventually release it with the help of backers from within KU." Eli Chapman

## KU Design Competition

On Thursday, October 20th WRHS took four students to the University of Kansas to compete in the High School Design Competition. High School Design is a free event that takes place annually in the fall, putting high school students' creativity, teamwork skills, technical knowledge, and abilities to the test. Each High School Design features new engineering design challenges in various engineering disciplines created by students in the Self Engineering Leadership Fellows (SELF) Program. Eli Chapman, Tyler Fullmer, L Walker, and Daniel Van Dalsem all competed in the Computer Science portion of the competition.

Students were required to come up with a project, complete written responses about their program, and present their project to a panel of judges. They were scored on a rubric to determine team placements.

Tyler and Eli provided the following description of their project:
Samplfy is a website we created to make it easier to learn about the music you listen to on
 Spotify. The website allows you to view all of your most listened to songs and artists from various time ranges as well as make playlists from those lists. We came up with the idea because we both really enjoy listening to music and wanted a new way to create more accurate playlists.
It is currently hosted on a web server run on a Raspberry PI and is located at https://samplfy.dev/. In order to use the service, you must have your Spotify account added to a whitelist before signing in, so that Spotify can access your data. We will eventually remove the need for this whitelist once the website is more finished. It currently uses Spotify's API alongside React, HTML, and Javascript to create a modern, functional website. In the future we have plans to add new features that will transform Samplfy into a more unique and interesting service. We are exploring machine learning and audio analysis to create even more accurate and tailored playlists. We also plan to revamp the UI in order to create a more unique and appealing color scheme and layout. This website is one that we plan to continue building in order to help users find more music.

KSU Computer Science High School Programming Contest
On Wednesday, November 2, 17 WRHS students attended the 28th Annual K-State High School Programming Contest, sponsored by the department of computer science at Kansas State University. This contest is open to all high school students. Each team can consist of up to four team members. Members must provide their own computer and choose a programming language that they know best. There are two divisions students can compete in, Advanced and Beginner. The division is based on their level of high school course experience.

The contest consisted of five rounds. During rounds one through four, teams had 25 minutes to solve a given programming problem. Points for each problem were awarded based on speed and accuracy. Students also got the opportunity to tour the engineering building at K-State and go on a campus tour.
