Reminder from Nurse Seitz:

AE parents,

Welcome back. I look forward to a fantastic school year with your children. I am the one responsible for keeping track and reporting all Covid related incidents in our building to district. I wanted to go over the new guidelines that our school district has adopted for the 2021-22 school year.

Masks

Wearing a mask although, highly encouraged, is optional for all students currently. If your child wears a mask properly, and is deemed a close contact of a positive case they will not need to quarantine for the mandatory 10-day period. If your child wears a mask and then tests positive, they will decrease the amount of potential close contacts.

Quarantine

Positive test with symptoms results in a 10-day quarantine from the onset of symptoms, as long as symptoms are resolving and person is afebrile for 72 hours without taking fever reducing medication.

Positive test without symptoms is a 10-day quarantine from the positive test results date. Close contacts are identified as anyone unvaccinated, 6 feet or less apart for 10 or more minutes

cumulatively, while indoors not wearing a mask. Once identified, close contacts need to quarantine for 10 days from the date of last contact with the positive case. If close contact becomes symptomatic they would need to have a PCR test performed and resulted before coming out of quarantine if negative and 10-day quarantine is completed, or starting a new positive test quarantine. If close contact remains asymptomatic on day 6 or after of quarantine they can have a PCR test performed and if negative can come out of quarantine on day 8.

Household contacts are identified as any person that lives with a person that tested positive. All household contacts have a 20-day quarantine period. The 10 days the positive case has and then an additional 10 days for themselves.

As with anything there is always multiple scenarios that can extend or reduce the amount of quarantine days. I ask that if a student, parent, or staff member has anything Covid related that they call and talk with me so we can work together to establish individualized timelines and a plan of care that is in accordance with what our district has set forth for the 2021-22 school year.
