

# Notes from the Nurse

Cold and flu season is among us. A quick review of the Elementary School Health guidelines regarding illness and medications.

# **HEALTH**

Please do not send your child to school if he/she has been vomiting, had diarrhea or has had a fever of 100.4 or above within the last 24 hours. Your child must be symptom free without the aid of medication, which includes fever-reducing medication for 24 hours before returning to school. If a child comes to school, he/she will be expected to participate in all areas, including recess and Physical Education, exceptions require a written request from the parent/guardian that is supported by a Medical Doctor or Doctor of Osteopathy. The request must include the activities and the dates the student cannot participate. As indicated in KSA 65-122 it is the duty of the parent, guardian, school principal, or other individual in charge of the public school to exclude there from any child or other person affected with a disease suspected of being infectious or contagious until the expiration of the prescribed period of isolation or quarantine for the particular infectious or contagious disease as outlined in the Kansas Classroom Handbook of Communicable Disease. # **MEDICATIONS**

All medication will be stored in the health room. Medication will be administered by the health personnel or designee. Prescription medication must be in the original container and must be accompanied by written permission from the parent/guardian and a Medical Doctor, Doctor of Osteopathy or dentist for each individual medication, and must be taken to the Health Room without delay for safekeeping. (Prescription label will be considered physician permission). It shall remain the responsibility of the student to- 7 report to the Health Room when dosage is due. Herbal remedies and vitamins will be considered as nonprescription medication (cough drops, Tylenol and Motrin) and will be subject to the same prescription requirements. When student medication is kept at school, it is the responsibility of the parent to know when the medication is to be refilled.

# Attention

Harvesters' BackSnack program provides a weekly bag filled with nutritious, child-friendly food for schoolchildren to take home over the weekend. # **Attendance and Transportation**

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit early so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Eventually good attendance will be a skill that will help them succeed in high school and beyond.

Good attendance has a positive connection with academic skills, social skills, and social emotional learning. Missing as few as two days per month can have a profound negative impact on achievement and a student's self-esteem. Help your student understand the importance of good attendance.

Good attendance is an important part of our ROAR expectations. AE has set our goal for a student absence to be four days or less by semester break. We will not include days required for quarantine. If your student is struggling with wanting to attend school, please contact the teacher, Ms. Boyd or Ms. Golden to discuss ways that the school can support your student.

If your student(s) are going to be absent or late to school, you need to call the front office by **9:00AM**. You can also email our front office secretaries. This way we can document you student(s) absence or late arrival to school. This will also allow our lunch room staff to know if they need to prepare a lunch for your student(s).

If your student(s) will be having a change in transportation for the day, please contact the front office staff by **3:00PM**. If the school is having an **EARLY RELEASE DAY**, please call the office by **2:00PM**. This way the secretaries will have enough time to deliver the message to your student(s).
