

2nd Grade #keeplearning Board #2




Even though we are not physically together, learning happens every day. This #keeplearning Board is designed to keep families and schools engaged with learning while we are apart.

Research things you can do there and include them in your brochure.</p>	<p>Record all the ways that you could make 100 using addition. (ex. $50+50=$; $90+10=$)</p>

Research what is involved with the job/career and write down a summary of the information you learn.</p>	<p>Write out a schedule of your day by the hour or half-hour and draw a clock to match the time.</p>
